WHO WE ARE:

Advocacy center for child and family safety and protection (ADCSAP-Uganda) is a non-government, non-profit making and non-partisan organization which was formed by a Team of six people in 2015 and formally registered with the registrar of companies in 2018 and also with the ministry of Internal Affairs under the Uganda National NGO Bureau with an aim of strengthening rural communities through ensuring that families and children are safe, healthy, educated, and encouraged to reach their full potential. We do this through:

- Fighting Poverty in families
- Promoting Quality education
- Promoting Financial literacy
- Promoting primary health care
- Advocating for family Safety and Child Protection

ADCSAP-Uganda currently operates in eight districts of Ruwenzori region western Uganda namely Kabarole, Bunyangabu, Kyenjojo, Ntoroko, Kyegegwa, Kamwenge, Kasese and Bundibugyo.



Child Trafficking



We provide direct assistance to rescue, protect and reintegrate victims of child trafficking into society. This is done through resettlement of Survivors of Human trafficking with their families particularly in case of children. This involves tracking families of the victims and then arrangements are made and children are taken to school.

Financial Literacy



We promote easy access to financial literacy through mobilizing rural families to form Village Saving and Loan Associations(VSLAs) to enable them start up small businesses for family sustainability and development.

Education



We promote education through sponsoring the vulnerable children from less privileged rural families and those that are affected by HIV/AIDS to access better education services hence enabling them realize their full potential.

Primary Health Care



We promote primary health care services through increased access to health care programs using flexible delivery strategies like reducing health care access barriers in rural communities which include work force shortages, low health literacy, poverty and among others.

ACHIEVEMENTS

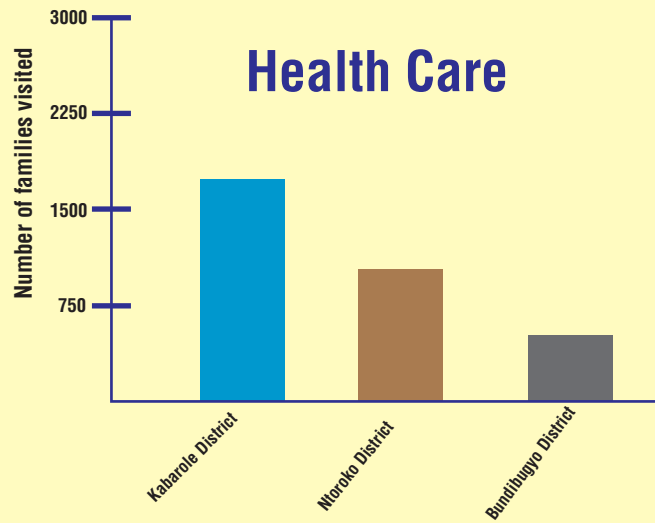


- We reached out to 600 families and supported them through providing counseling services

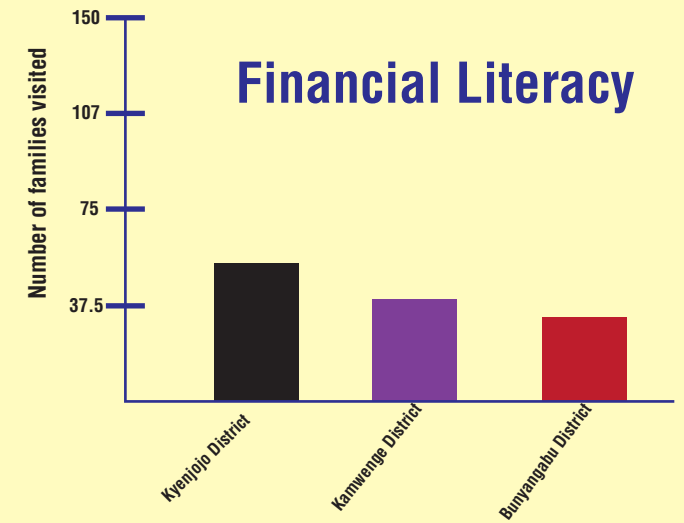


- In the year 2021 we supported 252 children in primary, secondary and in Vocational Training programs.

- 2021 was a good year whereby we managed to create and support a number of 150 VSLA's which has created a number of business opportunities to rural families.



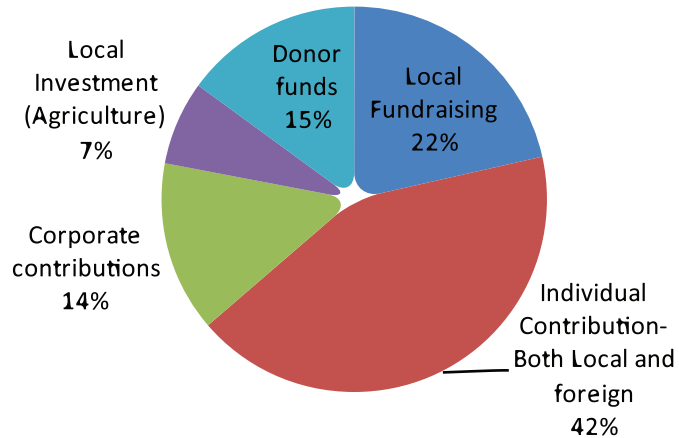
Going Forward

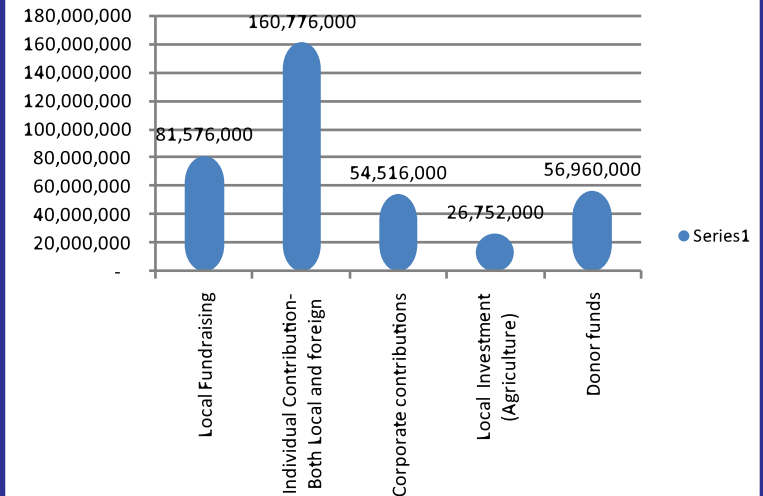

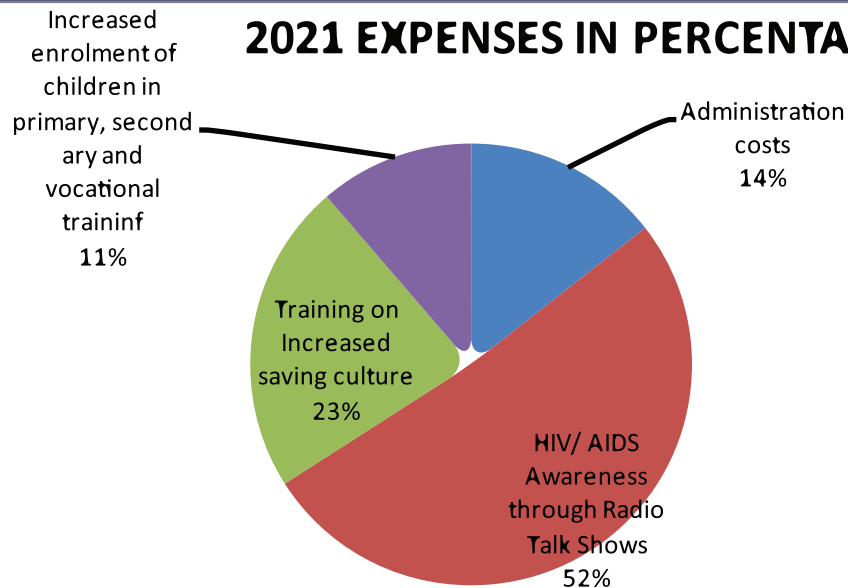
2021 INCOME IN PERCENTAGES



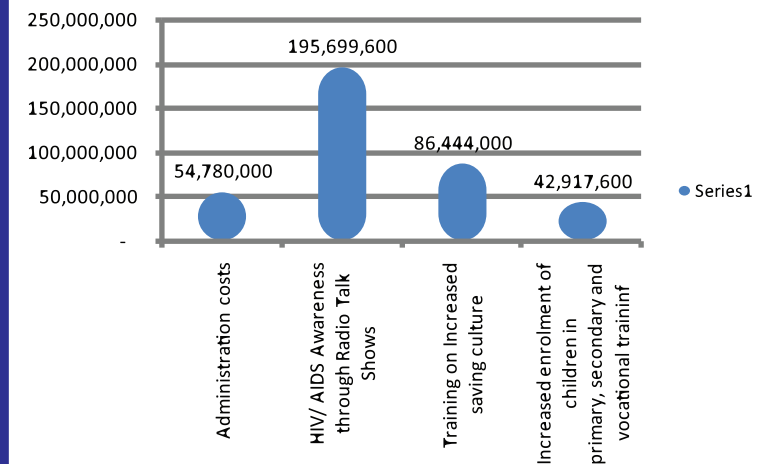
BAR GRAPH SHOWING 2021 INCOME
